Dear Mr. and Mrs. Taylor,

On August 30, 1945, the Secretary of the Interior accepted title to all lands within the boundaries of Fort Frederica National Monument.

You will recall the Special Use Permit you signed in January 1944. This permit becomes effective August 30, 1945 and remains in force for one year, with renewal for a further period of one year subject to the discretion of the Director of the National Park Service.

I am enclosing your copy of Permit No. I-39np-11 and a bill for one dollar. Checks should be made out to the Treasurer, United States, or if money orders are sent, they should be made payable by the Postmaster, Atlanta, Georgia.

In case your buildings have already been removed and you no longer desire the permit, please return your copy of the permit for cancellation and return the enclosed bill. If such is the case there will be no need for the payment of the \$1.00 permit fee.

SPECIAL USE PERMIT

Mr. and Mrs. H. D. Taylor, of St. Simons, Glynn Co., Georgia, is hereby authorized

during the term of one year from August 30, 1945, to August 30, 1946, to use the following-described land in the above-named national park:

**Tract of 6.21 acres shown on map No. NM-FRE-7001, and designated as Douglas Taylor on said map.**

for the purpose of **residential use as at present.**

subject to the conditions on the reverse hereof and to the payment to the Government of the United States of the sum of One dollar (\$ 1.00), in advance, ~~paid~~ annually

through the Coordinating Southeastern National Monuments, St. Augustine, Florida, payment to be made to Treasurer, United States.

## SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF THIS PERMIT

1. Permittee shall exercise this privilege subject to the supervision of the Superintendent of the Park and shall comply with the regulations of the Secretary of the Interior governing the park.

2. Use by the permittee of the land covered hereby is subject to the right of the Director, National Park Service, to establish trails, roads, and other improvements and betterments over, upon, or through said premises, and further to the use by travelers and others of such roads and trails as well as of those already existing.

3. No building or other structure shall be erected under this permit except upon plans and specifications approved by the Director, National Park Service, and the premises and all appurtenances thereto shall be kept in a safe, sanitary, and sightly condition.

4. Permittee shall dispose of brush and other refuse as required by the Superintendent.

5. Permittee shall pay the United States for any damage resulting from this use.

6. Permittee and his employees shall take all reasonable precautions to prevent forest fires and also shall assist the Superintendent to extinguish forest fires in the vicinity of any tract which may be used hereunder, and in the preservation of good order within the metes and bounds of the park.

7. No timber may be cut or destroyed without first obtaining permit therefor from the Director, National Park Service, in writing.

8. This permit may not be transferred or assigned without the consent of the Director, National Park Service, in writing.

9. This permit shall terminate upon the violation of any of the conditions hereof or of any Act of Congress or regulation of the Secretary of the Interior governing the park or anything in it, or at the discretion of the Director, National Park Service.

10. Neither Members of, nor Delegates to Congress, or Resident Commissioners, officers, agents, or employees of the Government shall be admitted to any share or part of this permit or derive, either directly or indirectly, any pecuniary benefit to arise therefrom.

11. Wherever the words "Superintendent of the Park" or "Park" are referred to in this permit they shall be construed as the "Superintendent of the Southeastern National Monuments" and "Monument" respectively.

12. This permit in the discretion of the Director of the National Park Service may be renewed for a further period of 1 year, or fraction thereof upon written application.

13. This permit shall become effective when title to the land described herein is vested in the United States. The permittee further agrees that he will recognize the title of the United States to the property when required and will surrender peaceful possession thereto within 90 days after receiving written notice from the Director of the National Park Service addressed to the permittee at the address shown on this permit.
